Subject: Restriction of the number of intake under PG scholarship scheme.

Sir/Madam

As per the scheme guidelines of PG scholarship, the following are the eligibility conditions for release of scholarship.

- i) Having a valid GATE/ GPAT score at the time of admission.
- ii) Must be admitted as a full-time scholar.
- iii) Admitted in AICTE approved Institutions / University Departments.
- iv) Admitted in AICTE approved programs in that year.
- v) The numbers of scholarships are restricted to the approved intake in the programme for that academic year.

Of late it is observed that a number of institutes while verifying and forwarding the online applications for PG scholarships have surpassed the intake limit and thereby violated the conditions incorporated in the approval letter and scheme guideline. In order to avoid such omission, it is reiterated that the number of intake should not exceed the intake perimeter given in the approval letter. However, if the concerned university/institute has implemented the Economically Weaker Section (EWS) quota in PG admission then the maximum number of students for PG scholarship per institute per programme should be restricted as per the approved intake of the corresponding programme with the provision of admitting a maximum of 10% of the intake by Economically Weaker Section (EWS) by following the guidelines of GOI.

It will be the responsibility of the university/institutes to check that the numbers of students are not exceeding the approved intake limit per programme, since they verify the correctness of the online applications before forwarding the same to AICTE. Violation of the norms will attract penalty as per provision in Approval Process Handbook (APH) 2020-21.
